PC & Head oriented on AMR impact on human health through animals and urged upon the farmers to use antibiotics judiciously under the supervision of Veterinarians. Dr M.Kishan Kumar, Director of Extension, PVNRTVGU, Hyderabad attended as chief guest and urged upon the farmers to implement whatever they have learnt & propagate the same at their villages to reduce the over usage of antibiotics.
